## **BIOGRAPHY:**

Juliette Virginia Phifer was born in Charlotte, North Carolina on January 3, 1905.<sup>1</sup> She graduated in 1928 from Slater State Normal School in Winston-Salem, NC. Juliette pursued a degree in Elementary Education at the Winston-Salem Teachers College and received a Bachelor of Science degree from that institution in 1929. She taught elementary school for seven years--teaching in each of the seven grades within the school. She received her Master of Arts in Education in 1933 from the Teachers College of Columbia University in NY. From 1933 to 1934, Juliette taught at the Newbold Training School, which was associated with the State Teachers College in Fayetteville, NC. In 1934-1935, she was on leave from the Fayetteville Teachers College as the State Supervisor of Adult Education at the North Carolina, USA Federal Emergency Relief Program. The following year, she returned to the Newbold Training School as the principal and remained there until 1946. Meanwhile in 1942, Ms. Burstermann embarked on her quest to obtain a doctoral degree in education, and commenced her studies at New York University. She completed all of the requirements and obtained the degree in 1948.<sup>2</sup> That same year she was hired as an Assistant Professor at Willimantic State Teachers College. She was the school's first African-American faculty member.<sup>3</sup> She married Louis C. Burstermann in New York in [1954].<sup>4</sup> In 1959 she was promoted to the rank of full professor<sup>5</sup> and remained at Eastern Connecticut State College until her retirement February 1, 1974.<sup>6</sup> Juliette Phifer Burstermann remained active in her support of education until her death in September of 1991.<sup>4</sup>

## **SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE:**

The Juliette Phifer Burstermann Collection is a collected history of Juliette P. Burstermann's life as an educator. The collection includes materials related to her education, her teaching career and her involvement with numerous outside organizations and committees. The collection includes personal correspondence, personal papers, news clippings and articles documenting many highlights of her career, plus information on her post-retirement activities and a video interview done in 1989.

## **SERIES DESCRIPTION:**

### Series I - Awards/Memberships/Certificates

The items in this category relate to both Dr. Burstermann's personal and professional involvement in various organizations. It includes a number of awards she received from organizations such as the Delta Gamma Kappa Society, AAUW - Connecticut Division, Association for Arts in Childhood and the Quality of Life Executive Committee.

### Series II - Conferences/Programs

The material in this series relates to Dr. Burstermann's professional involvement in various organizations including "Modern Math", Head Start Training and the WCCI World Conference on Education.

### Series III - Correspondence

The correspondence both personal and professional is divided by outgoing and incoming correspondence. It offers information on her continuing education and her teaching-

administrative activities at the Newbold Training School, Willimantic Teachers College, Brooklyn College and the Summer Institute at the College of the Virgin Islands.

#### Series IV - Curriculum

This series contains syllabi, tests and course descriptions as prepared by Dr. Burstermann as well as student term papers and a collection of children's writing saved from her first years as a professor at the Willimantic State Teachers College.

#### Series V – Personal Papers

This series contains transcripts, hiring and promotional documents, term papers, a copy of her thesis "Education in Haiti since 1934" and a variety of printed material prepared by Dr. Burstermann as she worked on her degree programs. It also includes items saved from her years as a professor and in retirement.

#### Series VI - Publications

The items in this series include news clippings, brochures, magazines and other printed material which offer samples of her writing and activities over the years. It also includes obituaries and tributes written following her death.

#### Series VII - Photographs

This series includes pictures from her personal collection and pictures taken during her years as an educator. Photographs date from the 1940s to the 1980s.

#### Series VIII - Realia

This series includes a copy of *Education for Peace* a book in which she wrote Part I of Chapter 4 (signed & personalized to Margaret "Peggy" and William "Billy" Wilson); 4 ribboned name tags from various conventions; a 1972 portrait-style photograph of Dr. Bursterman; copies of oversized newspapers, special retirement card signed by her colleagues and a video-taped interview with Dr. Burstermann dated April 1989.
