BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

Title	Church Farm Collection
Extent	4 linear feet. 5 boxes.
Arrangement	This collection is arranged in 6 series. Series include: Correspondence, Deeds/Land Records, Historical Data, Ledgers, Personal Papers, and Photographs. Within Correspondence, Historical Data, and Personal Papers, materials are arranged by subject. Within Deeds/Land Records, materials are arranged chronologically to maintain the historical narrative of the series.
Provenance	The Church Farm Collection was given to Eastern Connection State University via the ECSU Foundation, Inc. in 2008, which received the materials through the generous donation of Dorothy and Joe Zaring. The material in this collection was originally located within the Church Farm home in Ashford, CT.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE:

The Church Farm, situated on over 250 acres of land on Route 89 in Ashford, CT, was first purchased by the Church family in the 1840s. The land was farmed by the Churches until the mid to late 1870s when they moved to Hartford, beginning a long career of operating clothier companies in Hartford, Putnam, Danielson, and Willimantic. A farm ledger from 1907-1922 shows that although the clothing businesses kept the farm running, the farm did remain operational and productive during this time, selling livestock and animal products including butter and wool. Though not their primary residence, the Church Farm Homestead continued to be a beloved summer vacation home for the family until the 1960s.

In 2008, the Church Farm and 110 acres were gifted to Eastern Connecticut State University, where it became the Church Farm Center for the Arts and Sciences – a convergence of interdisciplinary educational opportunities for ECSU students, from field studies to landscape art classes.

The Church Farm Collection contains materials and documents taken from the home relating to the farm and clothier businesses, as well as extensive family photographs. Though largely undated, the photographs range from family portraits and photographs of the farm house and business fronts, to snapshots from vacations and time spent at the farm during the early 1900s. Business and personal accounting ledgers run from 1842 to 1925; the personal ledgers dating from 1915-1925 illustrate the finances and expenditures of the Church family prior to the Depression. Also of particular interest is an April 2009 interview with Dorothy and Joe Zaring conducted by Dr. Barbara Tucker, Professor of History and Director of the Center for Connecticut Studies at ECSU.

SERIES DESCRIPTION:

Series I – Correspondence

This series includes personal letters from Dorothy Church Zaring to Art McCann, site manager of the Church Farm, regarding his work toward a history of the farm; letters from the Connecticut Bank & Trust to Dorothy Church Zaring regarding Henry E. Church's trust after the death of her mother, Louise; and an inspection letter from the CT Trust for Historical Preservation noting needed repairs on the farm house.

Series II – Deeds / Land Records

The material in this series includes deeds and other land records (legal-sized documents) related to the Church Farm property.

Series III – Historical Data

This series includes notes, photographs, and other records relating to the history of the Church Farm. A chronology of the Church Farm and Dorothy Church Zaring's recollections are an interesting guide to the events and history related to the farm and the Church family.

Series IV – Ledgers

This series is a mix of business, personal, and farm accounts for the Church family. The most extensive ledgers are the personal accountings of the Church family from 1915-1925. Business ledgers include the years 1842-1905. The one farm ledger accounts for the years 1907-1922.

Series V – Personal Papers

This series includes notes and personal items from Henry E. Church and Dorothy Church Zaring, including school notebooks and a contemporary interview with Dorothy and Joe Zaring from April 2009.

Series VI – Photographs

This series includes family photos displayed in the Church Farm home, two scrapbooks, a photo album, and 16 stereoscope cards. The photo album encompasses mainly photos of the Church family at the farm, but also includes some photos of the family at Money Island and at their home(s) in Hartford, CT. Most photos are undated, but according to a typewritten note taped to the inside cover of the album, the photos date from 1906-1914. Scrapbook 1 includes clippings from newspapers, including poetry, news items, items related to Church family members and the Freeman Church Company, obituaries of J.W. Church (1910), and signed (often handwritten) poems by G.L. Dickinson. Scrapbook 2 appears to be a childhood scrapbook from 1916 with clipped poems, stories, and family photos. The photo album and two scrapbooks have been disassembled from their bindings, but kept in their original order. Five enlarged and mounted photographs are located in Box 5. “Visit to Church Farm” dated March 2012, a pictorial collection by Lundy Wantland, is filed with the photographs in Box 2 (ConservPhase box).
