BIOGRAPHY:

Margaret Vose was a faculty member in the school of Fine Arts at Eastern Connecticut State University from 1979-1993 and served as acting director of the Akus Gallery for many years between 1980 and the time of her retirement in 1993.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE:

This collection contains 93 playbills representing 24 theatres located in New York and Southern New England. Plays range from modern (*Kiss of the Spider Woman*) to classical (*King Lear*) and reflects Professor Vose's lifelong interest in live theatre.
